1. Go to the Library Website and choose "Merlin Library Catalog".

2. In Merlin, select "Jrnl, Mag, Newspaper" and type in Science then click on Search.

3. Choose "Science" twice. In the middle of the page there is a link to the ejournal:



4. Link to web version. In the middle of the page, choose the link: v. 275(1997)

5. Scroll down to browse by year:

6. Choose 2009- Volumes 323-326, Issues 5910-5960.

7. Then choose Vol. 326: 2 Oct. 2009-18 Dec. 2009.

8. Select the 2 October 2009 edition.

11. The supplementary article is in the "Perspectives" section.

12. Click on the PDF button, and then you can save it or print it.
